

Airline Transport Pilot (ATP) – Basic Facts

Minimum Age: 23

Other Requirements: You need to be able to read, understand and speak the English language. You have to be of good moral character. Hold at least a CPL and IFR rating. **1500 hours total time**, of which 500 hours are cross country, 100 hrs at night, 75 hours of instrument time and more detailed requirements.

Rating types: There are various types of ATP rating. We prepare for the multi-engine ATP as well for the single-engine ATP.

Duration: The actual training can be completed within 1-2 weeks.

Program: The program is done on an individual basis and varies highly by the flight experience and knowledge-level of the candidate. For example, many ATP students have been instructors for more than 1000 hours and are usually pretty sharp when it comes to demonstrate aeronautical knowledge and practical skills.

Written Test: The candidate has to pass a written Test (100 questions).

Exam: The ATP check-ride (oral and flight-test) can be done with an FAA designated examiner. There is no sign-off needed for the check-ride.

IACRA: Integrated Airman Certification and/or Rating Application is an Internet/ computer based registration system for your check-ride. You need to use IACRA for the ATP test registration.
